

Cohousing Development

in the Residential Zone

High Street, Dunedin

A unique proposal for 26 households to be developed on the redundant High Street Primary School site. The urban cohousing proposal will be Dunedin's equivalent to the Earthsong Eco-Neighbourhood in Auckland. It will provide 26 individual household owned via the Unit Title Act with a community facility housing a common room/kitchen, workshop, two guest bedrooms and an office.





Resource consent was required because of the residential density and the emphasis on alternative transport rather than private cars.

Our Role: Preparation of the resource consent application and the required assessment of environmental effects.

the hearings process.
